#### **Northern Plains Province Chapter Buddies**



# NPP Officer Reports Continued...

#### **Chaplain—Kyle Lyons**

The Leadership & Professional Development Committee held their May meeting to review our charges from spring assembly and to discuss our goals for the year. A few highlights of the meeting was to organize a Reach Out and Read event that would kick off at the beginning of the fall 2018 semester and go until fall assembly, to invite at least one representative from each chapter to join the committee to improve province wide communication, creating a L&PD link on the NPP website to act as a resource and reference center for easy accessibility and convince, and discussed ways to restructure the province assembly agenda so that it will allow for more opportunities to implement activities that will provide leadership and professional growth. We also discussed the need for a private NPP webpage that would allow us to share NPP related information (i.e. contact list for RPh brothers) to ensure that personal information isn't shared publicly. I filmed a national Kappa Psi promo video highlighting the the 59th GCC theme of "Making an Impact." The video discussed the recent successes of our spring assemblies Reach Out and Read philanthropy event and ways chapters/ Provinces could get involved. I am currently working with province Chaplains to establish a protocol involving the usage and transportation of the newly purchased ritual regalia. I will also be attending the 1st annual Regent retreat this June and will giving a presentation titled, "Keeping Traditions While Moving Forward and Making Changes." I believe this will provide a focus for province Regents on the importance of rituals and ritual workshops, changes we have made that have benefited our fraternity, and common roadblocks to implementing change and how to combat them.
